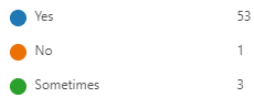


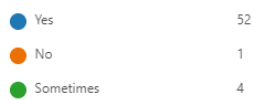
Pupil Voice Summary February 2021

Pupil Voice survey on safeguarding and behaviour demonstrates that the vast majority feel safe in school, have someone that they can talk to and are listened to:

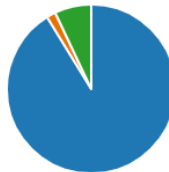
2. I enjoy school.



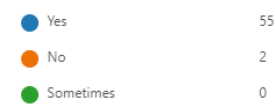
3. Teachers help me do my best.



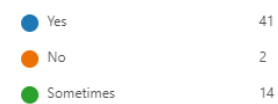
6. Teachers listen to what I have to say.

- **All of the children** could talk about way that school promotes staying safe in light of Covid-19, with 96% saying that their teacher helps to remind them.

Actions

- Continue to ensure that any incident resulting in the child being recorded in the incident log, including lunchtimes and that this is reported to parents as per behaviour policy.
- Follow up pupil survey by observing playtimes and lunchtimes, taking on feedback from lunchtime staff.
- Ensure that there is sufficient play equipment for classes at play and lunchtime. Children brought up need for more playtime equipment and are presenting a wish list to Mr Baxter.
- Remind children of the behaviour systems in school, so that they recognise when and how behaviours are addressed and ensure they are aware of the term.
