* You can enter as many times as you like!



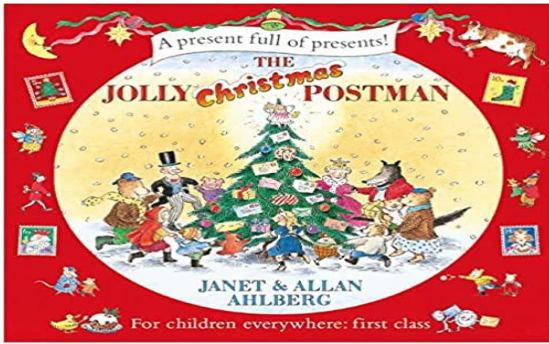
